CLIL (Content and Language Integrated Learning)

1 & 2 WEEK COURSES

FOR SECONDARY TEACHERS WHO TEACH THEIR SUBJECT "BILINGUALLY" IN ENGLISH
in England and the Republic of Ireland 2020

These courses are designed for secondary & vocational school teachers who teach or plan to teach their subject "bilingually" in English. Applications are also welcome from teachers who have a general interest in CLIL and teachers of English who are involved in CLIL

HISTORY, GEOGRAPHY & OTHER HUMANITIES (History of Art, Social Studies, Religious Studies, Music, Economics etc.)
& **VOCATIONAL SUBJECTS** such as Tourism, Business Studies & Secretarial Studies

AND

SCIENCE, MATHS & TECHNICAL SUBJECTS

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

Erasmus+

These courses aim to provide teachers with the opportunity:

- To consider CLIL methodology and to acquire expertise and fresh ideas for teaching their subject in English
- To acquire ready made teaching materials and to evaluate, adapt and create materials for teaching their subject(s) in English
- To consider the effective use of digital technology in planning and implementing CLIL lessons
- To refresh/improve their language skills, focusing on the language required to teach their subject(s) in English



COURSE CONTENT:

1. Workshops on Content and Language Integrated Learning (CLIL) Methodology:

conducted by expert CLIL teacher trainers with many years of experience in training European Teachers and a wealth of exciting ideas to impart

The workshops include:

- principles of CLIL/ 'bilingual' methodology
- roles of language and curriculum content in CLIL/ 'bilingual' pedagogy : balance and emphasis
- using digital technology in CLIL
- introduction to practical examples of bilingual tasks from one curriculum theme (eg. History or Biology): comparison with monolingual tasks and task types
- monolingual and bilingual textbook evaluation
- assessment issues in CLIL
- reading strategies for bilingual learners
- thinking skills

Some sessions will include trainer presentation of concepts and materials which lead to a discussion and response. Other sessions will encourage participants to critically evaluate currently available materials (in pairs and groups) and produce materials and topic frameworks. Participants will be asked to do the tasks designed for students – a debate, a role play, a simulation, a range of reading tasks (including jigsaw reading) and writing tasks (including process writing).

2. **A lecture on Secondary Education in England** focusing on Maths or Science or History & Humanities and **Discussion comparing the teaching of Humanities or Science or Maths in the different European countries represented** – curriculum, materials, methods, standards, assessment, national education policies etc.
3. **Visits to secondary schools** with the opportunity to observe lessons in Geography, History, Science, Maths or other subjects requested by individuals. (Not on one week courses or in school holidays).
4. **English Language Training** – 2 or 3 days (on courses marked (L) - see programmes.)

5. Historical, Geographical or Scientific visits:

- Visit the Big Pit National Coal Mining Museum of Wales at Blaenavon World Heritage Site and Visit St. Fagans National History Museum (Open-Air Museum of Welsh Life and St Fagans Castle)
- Visit Gloucester Cathedral and Visit Tewkesbury: Geographical Perspectives: Floods + Town Planning and Historical Perspectives: Medieval Tewkesbury (certain 2 week Humanities courses only)

(a) COURSE FEE: to include:

Full programme of study sessions and visits as itemized above.

NB. Participants are responsible for paying their own daily transport costs, including transport to secondary schools/colleges. Optional excursions are not included in the price.

(b) HOST FAMILY ACCOMMODATION* to include:

Full board accommodation with a local family (inclusive of registration fee): 7, 12 or 13 nights
(Teachers may request to be the only guest of their mother tongue or to stay in the same family as a colleague).

Host families are carefully selected and offer a friendly welcome and opportunities to chat and learn more about life in Britain or Ireland today. Participants often find that the experience of staying with a host family is one of the most memorable aspects of the course. Accommodation is in single rooms (unless participants request to share). Breakfast, packed lunch and evening meal are provided by the host family. (Food allergies, likes and dislikes are taken into account.)

Please note that many of the suitable residential areas are not within walking distance of the town centre, and most host families are an easy bus ride from the town centre/tuition centre. Local transport from host families to the town centre and local schools is at participants' own expense and is likely to cost 15-40 Euro per week.

Additional nights with host families can be arranged, giving participants extra time for individual research and visits. Accommodation can be provided for family members (but not unaccompanied children) subject to availability. (Rates on request).

* **Except Cambridge** where the accommodation provided is central university-style, self-catering (single bedroom en-suite).

Participants wishing to arrange their own (hotel or self-catering) accommodation may pay a fee for the course only.

PAYMENT:

Full payment will be due 2 months before the course begins, or for teachers awaiting funding – as soon as the grant is received. Cancellation charges apply for cancellations 4 weeks or less before the course commences. 3-4 weeks before arrival: cancellation fee: 380 Euros. No refund for cancellations within 3 weeks of arrival. Applicants are strongly advised to take out cancellation insurance.

PREPARATION:

Participants are asked to complete a questionnaire before the course starts in order to ascertain their level of experience and training, the age groups and types of learners they teach and their expectations before the course. This helps trainers to respond to participants' individual needs and ensure that the most relevant areas are carefully integrated. Suggestions for optional pre-course reading are given.

OUTCOMES:

Participants will return with

- ready-made materials for immediate use in class and sources for obtaining additional materials
- lesson plans and topic plans
- insights into how C.L.I.L. can be implemented and expanded in their schools at all levels and with students of all abilities and language proficiencies

By the end of the course participants will be able to:

- define the relationship between content and language
- construct tasks which combine curriculum content and new language
- modify monolingual materials for use in bilingual classrooms
- plan a series of bilingual lessons (C.L.I.L.) on one topic
- provide learners with a range of learning strategies for bilingual learning
- predict language needs in texts and tasks
- introduce a range of different task types.

EVALUATION:

At the end of the course teachers participate in a detailed evaluation of the course.

FOLLOW UP:

At the end of the course teachers are asked to consider which aspects of the course will be the most relevant to their own teaching situations. On their return they are invited to keep a record of how they have been able to utilise ideas gained on the course in their own classrooms. They are encouraged to share their experiences with their fellow participants by email.

LOCATIONS:

CAMBRIDGE, England: Population: 138,000, 63 miles (100 kilometres) north of London (1 hour by rail).

Cambridge is a beautiful historic city, world famous for its prestigious university with its magnificent ancient colleges and lovely riverside. It has picturesque shopping streets, fascinating museums and attractive parks.

The most convenient airports for Cambridge are Stansted & Luton, which have direct bus links to Cambridge. If arriving at other airports, travel is via central London.

CHELTENHAM, England: Population: 117,000; 98 miles (157 kilometres) west of London (2¼ hours by rail)

Cheltenham is an elegant spa town, situated on the edge of the Cotswold Hills, which are famous for their picturesque stone villages. Cheltenham is known for its Regency architecture, colourful parks and gardens and it has many attractive residential areas.

The most convenient airports: Heathrow (direct National Express Coach to Cheltenham), Birmingham (rail to Cheltenham) or Bristol (airport bus then rail to Cheltenham)

PORTSMOUTH, England: Population: 207,000; 75 miles (214 kilometres) south-west of London (1½ hours by rail).

Portsmouth, situated on the south coast, is an important port, famous for its historic ships - most notably Nelson's "Victory". Old Portsmouth overlooks the busy historic maritime harbour, while the attractive seaside resort area of Southsea, with its parks and gardens and two piers, has four miles of seafront with views across to the Isle of Wight.

The most convenient airports: Southampton (rail to Portsmouth), Heathrow (direct National Express coach to Portsmouth) or Gatwick (direct coach or rail to Portsmouth)

DUBLIN, Ireland: Population: 570,000.

Situated on the east coast of Ireland, Dublin is a lively city with a rich history. Notable historic sights include its elegant Georgian squares, Dublin Castle, Christ Church Cathedral, the Book of Kells at Trinity College and National Museums. Temple Bar is a busy riverside neighbourhood with live Irish folk music venues.

GALWAY, Ireland: Population: 80,000; 200 kilometres west of Dublin.

Galway is a lively harbour city on Ireland's west coast. It has many festivals and is a hub for traditional Irish music. The winding lanes of the Latin Quarter are the heart of the historical and cultural area of the city, with street entertainment and interesting shops. The city's seaside area, Salthill, has a fine beach overlooking Galway Bay.

There are direct buses from Dublin Airport to Galway.

TRAVEL:

Transport at the beginning and end of the course is not provided and InterEducation regrets that it is unable to assist with travel arrangements.
